Registration processes

An applicant must meet the requirements of the current policy at the time their application is considered. All practitioners must adhere to the Board's psychotherapist supervision policy.

Grandparenting

The Board has yet to accredit New Zealand-based psychotherapy qualifications. Prior to accreditation taking place, the Board has agreed to grandparent practitioners undertaking Board-approved qualifications. The qualifications approved by the Board can be found on the Board's website and in the policy statement below.

Pathways to registration


The Board has developed two pathways to registration depicted in the flow chart below:

TERTIARY PATHWAY

Prerequisite: An approved master's level qualification in psychotherapy from a New Zealand university or New Zealand training institution or comparable qualification.

Child and Adolescent Psychotherapist:

Completion of 900 hours of supervised clinical child and adolescent therapeutic practice over at least 3 years with clinical supervision provided by a psychotherapist registered in the Psychotherapist Scope of Practice with Child and Adolescent Psychotherapist Specialism. Hours not completed during qualification may be completed postqualification.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PATHWAY

Prerequisite: Recognition of prior learning (RPL) from related disciplines¹ and satisfactory completion of an initial assessment accredited by the Board.²



Eligible for registration in the Interim Psychotherapist Scope of Practice



Psychotherapist: Completion of 900 hours of supervised clinical psychotherapy practice with clients over at least 3 years with clinical supervision provided by a psychotherapist registered in the Psychotherapist Scope of Practice. Hours not completed during qualification may be completed post-qualification.

Child and Adolescent Psychotherapist:

Completion of 900 hours of supervised clinical child and adolescent therapeutic practice over at least 3 years with clinical supervision provided by a psychotherapist registered in the Psychotherapist Scope of Practice with Child and Adolescent Psychotherapist Specialism. Hours not completed during qualification may be completed post-qualification.

Interim Psychotherapist Scope of Practice

Acceptance into the Interim Psychotherapist Scope of Practice must be for the purpose of achieving registration in either the Psychotherapist Scope of Practice or the Psychotherapist Scope of Practice with Child and Adolescent Psychotherapist Specialism. Practitioners can only remain in the Interim Psychotherapist Scope of Practice for 5 years.⁵
